Krytar Inc. Conflict Minerals Policy

The US Congress in 2010 enacted the conflict minerals provisions of the Dodd-Frank Financial Reform legislation. Krytar supports the law's aim to curb violence and human rights abuses in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC), the Republic of Congo, the Central African Republic, South Sudan, Uganda, Rwanda, Burundi, Tanzania, Zambia.

Krytar's policy is to avoid purchasing parts that contain minerals obtained from conflict sources. Upon becoming a new supplier to Krytar, supplier will be required to disclose if parts contain conflict minerals such as Gold, Tungsten, Tantalum or Tin. If necessary, supplier shall fill out and submit the Conflict Minerals Reporting Template.
